Manuscripts are invited from academician, research students & scientists for publications consideration. Papers are accepted for editorial consideration through e-mail: <u>submission@ijces.org</u> or <u>editor.ijces@gmail.com</u> with the understanding that they have not been published, submitted or accepted for publication elsewhere. Papers accepted for publisher may not be published elsewhere in the same form, either in the language of the paper or any other language, without the consent of the editorial board.

## **SUBMISSION**

## **STYLE**

Manuscripts should be attached and sent to the editor via e-mail: The file has to be written in the following software: MS-Word Format for IBM Compatible Computers.

## LENGTH

An IJCES Transaction paper should not exceed 10 typeset, printed pages.

## **ORDER OF PARTS**

Title of article, author's name, author's institutional affiliations, abstracts (150 to 200 words describing the purpose, methods, results, and conclusions of the study), main text, Table (each starting with a caption) and figure captions, list of symbols and abbreviations (if necessary), numbered list of references, and original figures.

#### **REVIEW PROCESS**

All manuscripts are reviewed by an editor and members of the Editorial Board or qualified outside reviewers. Decisions will be made as rapidly as possible, and the journal strives to return reviewers' comments to authors within 2 weeks. The editorial board will re-review manuscripts that are accepted & pending for revision. It is the goal of the IJCES to publish manuscripts within 4 weeks after submission.

## **TITLE OF THE PAPER**

The Title should be a brief phrase describing the contents of the paper. The Title Page should include the authors' full names and affiliations, the name of the corresponding author along with phone, fax and E-mail information.

# **AUTHOR NAMES AND AFFILIATIONS**

It is IJCES policy that all those who have participated significantly in the technical aspects of a paper be recognized as co-authors or cited in the acknowledgments. In case of a paper with more than one author, correspondence concerning the paper will be sent to the first author unless being advised otherwise. Author name should consist of first name, middle initial, last name. The author affiliation should consist of the following, as applicable, in the order as: Company or college (with department name or company division), Postal address, City, state, zip code, Country name and e-mail.

## ABSTRACT

The Abstract should be informative and completely self-explanatory, briefly present the topic, state the scope of the experiments, indicate significant data, and point out major findings and conclusions. The Abstract should be 150 to 200 words in length. Complete sentences, active verbs, and the third person should be used, and abstract should be written in the past tense. Standard nomenclature should be used and abbreviations should be avoided. No literature should be cited.

Following the abstract, about 3 to 5 key words that will provide indexing references should be listed.

## **INTRODUCTION**

The Introduction should provide a clear statement of the problem, the relevant literature on the subject, and the proposed approach or solution. It should be understandable to colleagues from a broad range of scientific disciplines.

# **MANUSCRIPT BODY**

Subdivide the body into section to emphasize both content and clarity. Use headings and subheadings to understand the research clearly. Discuss clearly the analysis and interpretation of the findings. Results are to be given clearly. Mention ways to improve or expand your research.

## **RESULTS**

Results should be presented with clarity and precision. The results should be written in the past tense when describing findings in the authors' experiments. Previously published findings should be written in the present tense. Results should be explained, but largely without referring to the literature. Discussion, speculation and detailed interpretation of data should not be included in the Results but should be put into the Discussion section. Better is to use tables and figures to show results. Explanation should be given clearly under each table and figure.

#### **DISCUSSION**

The Discussion should interpret the findings in view of the results obtained in current work and in past studies of this topic. State the conclusions in a few sentences at the end of the paper. The Results and Discussion sections can include subheadings, and when appropriate, both sections can be combined.

## **CONCLUSION AND FUTURE SCOPE**

Mention clearly the conclusion of the research work carried out and future scope of the research work.

## ACKNOWLEDGMENT

The Acknowledgments of people, grants, funds, etc should be brief.

## **TABLES**

Tables should be kept to a minimum and be designed to be as simple as possible. Tables are to be typed double-spaced throughout, including headings and footnotes. Each table should be on a separate page, numbered consecutively in numerals and supplied with a heading and a legend. Tables should be self-explanatory without reference to the text. The details of the methods used in the experiments should preferably be described in the legend instead of in the text. The same data should not be presented in both table and graph form or repeated in the text.

## **FIGURE**

Figure legends should be typed in numerical order on a separate sheet. Graphics should be prepared using applications capable of generating high resolution GIF, TIFF, JPEG or Powerpoint before pasting in the Microsoft Word manuscript file. Use numerals to designate figures and upper case letters for their parts (e.g. Figure 1). Begin each legend with a title and include sufficient description so that the figure is understandable without reading the text of the manuscript. Information given in legends should not be repeated in the text.

## **REFERENCE LIST CITATION**

Reference citations in the text should be identified by numbers in square brackets as [1], [2] etc.

## REFERENCE

References should be listed at the end of the paper in alphabetical order. Articles in preparation or articles submitted for publication, unpublished observations, personal communications, etc. should not be included in the reference list but should only be mentioned in the article text. Journal names are abbreviated according to Chemical Abstracts. Authors are fully responsible for the accuracy of the references.

# PAPER ACCEPTANCE

The final decision on publication is made by the Editor-in-Chief upon recommendation of Editorial Board Members and reviewers report. If the manuscript is accepted for publication in IJCES, it must not be published in any periodical elsewhere without the permission of the editorial board.

## **COPYRIGHT**

Copyright in published papers will be vested in the publisher. It is the authors' responsibility to obtain and submit all written permissions required, including permission to quote material which has appeared in another publication. Authors are required to sign and submit the completed "Copyright Agreement Form" upon acceptance of publication of the paper.

# **AUTHORS RESPONSIBILITY**

Correspondence and proofs for correction will be sent to the first-named author who will be the corresponding author of the paper, unless otherwise indicated. Corrected page proofs must be returned direct to the editor within a week time. Corrections shall be limited to typographical errors; no new

material may be inserted. Corresponding author is responsible for updating affiliations and contacts of all of the authors.

## **PUBLICATION COST**

There is no charge for the processing of paper but author(s) of each accepted paper is required to pay the publication charge which is very nominal fees. We charge Rs. 2000 for Indian Authors and US\$ 100 for International Authors for maximum 4 authors. The fees depends upon the number of pages, number of authors, images etc. Before the accepted paper is published we will intimate the fees in the acceptance letter.
